EXTRACT from the Minutes of an Ordinary Meeting of the URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL of PONTYPRIDD held on the 3rd day of November, 1931.

"HEN WLAD FY NHADAU" MEMORIAL YNYSANGHARAD PARK AND COMMEMORATIVE TARLET MILL STREET.

1145. A letter dated 2nd November 1931 was read from Messrs. Rhys Morgan and J. Colenso Jones, the Joint Hon. Secretaries of "Hen Wlad Fy Nhadau" Memorial Committee stating

(1) That the Committee had now completed their work in connection with the Memorial erected in Ynysangharad Park and the Commemorative Tablet in Mill Street Pontypridd and had a balance in hand of £105;

(2) That the Committee would be glad if the Council either in its own name or in the names of the Chairman and Clerk for the time being of the Council would accept the £105 as Trustees with a view to the interest on the money being retained by the Council for the purpose of the maintenance of both Memorials;

(3) That in the event of the Council agreeing to either of the courses suggested the money would be paid to the Council's Treasurer immediately but it would be necessary for the Council to pass a resolution and to hand the Memorial Committee a copy thereof under the Council's seal.

RESOLVED :-

- (a) That the congratulations of the Council be extended to the Chairman, Members and Joint Hon. Secretaries of the Memorial Committee upon the very successful completion of their labours;
- (b) That the sum of £105 now offered by the Memorial Committee be accepted and that the Council as Trustees of such sum hereby undertake to invest the same and apply the interest received from time to time on such investment solely for the purpose of maintaining the Memorial and Tablet;
- (c) That a copy of this Minute under the Common Seal of the Council and attested by the Chairman and Clerk be handed over to the Joint Hon. Secretaries of the Memorial Committee.
